chair report

Foundry Arts Space workshop a step closer.

The Foundry Arts Space has been investigating the development of the shed behind as a creative workshop area. We receive many queries on classes and workshops but have been unable to facilitate these due to lack of space. Our vision is a workshop adjacent to the Foundry, on the existing footprint, divided into two areas. A clean area to facilitate art classes and present small pop-up exhibitions, plus a small storage area and a "dirty" area for messy art classes, such as pottery.

As part of this process, we approached Campaspe Shire Council to implement the next step of the Echuca Creative Arts Space Plan (2019) which is to repurpose the existing "tin" shed adjacent to the Foundry as a functional space to provide for community use.

The development of the adjacent garden as per the Echuca Creative Arts Space Plan (2019) is an exciting opportunity to incorporate this area into the Foundry exhibitions and activities, such as outdoor sculpture exhibitions. art markets performances. The workshop would connect directly with the garden enabling a flow from the garden through to the new workshop and existing gallery.

We are delighted to announce that Council has agreed to fund the design and planning process for the renovation of the existing tin shed into a creative workshop area.

This is step one of the project, as we work with Council to develop the design of the workshop. This is probably a 2- or 3-year project as further funding will be required to do the renovation.

Our thanks to Campaspe Shire Mayor, Cr Rob Amos, Cr Paul Jarman and the councillors for their support in gaining this funding.

The opening of "Walking Through the Decades" went very well despite the drizzle. The garden area was well illuminated by the "fairy" lights and kept warm by 3 braziers. It showed us the possibilities for this area, including using the new "container".

McPherson Media is publishing a new magazine called "Heart the Art. We are delighted to be a part of this publication along with other community art groups in the region. Pleasingly, Campaspe Shire Council is covering the costs for our involvement in the magazine for which we are very grateful.



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






Walking Through the Decades:

The opening night of the Art Prize 'Nature Speaks' was full of eager visitors keen to see how artists had responded to the theme.

Congratulations to Suzanne Bentley for winning the overall prize with her stunning sculpture "Leaves in the Wind." Highly commended went to Linda M. Schneider and the Local Prize went to Bronwen Quill. Judges Caroline Esbenshade and Lucila Zentner were amazed at the variety of entries and you are encouraged to make sure you see the exhibition before it finishes on the 18th August!

Echuca library hosted a well attended event where nine artists received awards and constructive feedback from judges, Caroline Esbenshade and Lucila Zentner. The Winner of the Youth Prize was Cara Haley with her fascinating felted textiles work. Tyrese Baker and Charlotte Turner received Highly Commended awards.





Both Lu Bennett and Christopher Shelton will be exhibiting in our gallery late August. We look forward to seeing where their art practice has been taking them. We asked them a few questions in the lead up to seeing their work:

A BOOK OF DAYS - LU BENNETT

Tell us about your upcoming exhibition. What ideas/themes are you exploring?

The work, Book of Days, is a 7 metre long work on paper. It's a raw and quivering conversation between two women, myself as an artist and Alex as a model, just hanging out on Zoom each doing what we do, because she needs to move, I need to draw, and these are the languages with which we express the things we never say out loud. This is the method we chose to hold space for each other.

What has inspired the ideas/themes you are exploring?

Separated by 16000 km as we work online via Zoom, the degrees of difficulty are multiplied by Alex's constant movement. There are no timed poses here, just music (Deftones, specifically) and Alex moving, exorcising, across the floor. In this environment poses are fleeting moments and creative decision becomes evisceration as the figure unforms into gestural shapes, line repetitions, energy and abstraction. It is supremely alla prima in momento.

In combination, our community was preparing for inundation during the 2022-23 River Murray flood event and this inspired the mural format with longer lines allowing a human landscape of unspoken things to unfold within the work.

What materials have you been using to create the artworks you intend to exhibit?

I like to work in charcoal or pastel on paper. They are the most authentic and immediately gratifying of materials. Charcoal sticks are uniquely individual but one becomes attuned to knowing the characteristics of each new stick by it's sound on the paper, this one scratchy and textured, that one an oily, smudginess; some leave silvery soft marks and others, a sharp blackness. I often think about trees when I draw and try to recycle my paper over and over, allowing an archaeology of marks to infuse the substrate of a drawing.

For Book of Days, I've used charcoal to express my lines on paper but also explored its use as a powder or paint. Accompanying the main work are large-scale abstracted figurative forms in acrylic on canvas with use of cold wax, and smaller charcoal encaustic pieces.

Tell us about your background as an artist?

Beyond my formal art education which began 30 years ago at BRIT in Bendigo and continued through an Art and Archaeology BA at Flinders University, it was the emergence of online life drawing during the Covid pandemic that invigorated my passion for figure. I've since had the pleasure of learning, drawing and being inspired within a global community of likeminded artists and models.

FORMED BY TIME - CHRISTOPHER SHELTON.

This exhibition continues my ongoing theme of "the figure in the landscape". Real or imagined. Sometimes the inspiration is directly in front of you and we still miss it

A rocky outcrop 2 km on the LHS, west of Pyalong / Heathcote Victoria on a grassy knoll. This Sentinel appears to be looking over the political landscape whilst wrestling with the aftermath of the changing climate.

I paint on linen. Using the best quality oil paints in my search for that perfect finished surface. My success will be judged by others. I'm not a picture maker.

My professional career was 44 years in Arts Education. I have produced 16 solo exhibitions and participated in numerous group shows. ART = LIFE.
