After 13 years the members present voted unanimously to change the name to The Foundry Arts Space Inc. The purpose and activities will not change, just the name. The change will take effect once we have notified ASIC and the necessary legal and financial institutions. At the AGM, we farewelled Tim Smallwood, Tarli

Bird, and Leanne Cuffe from the committee. The committee will miss their expertise, knowledge, and enthusiasm. Tim has been a member since 2018, serving as chairperson for three of those years. He was also on the exhibition team and initiated upgrades to the kitchen, shop, and our lighting capability. Tarli joined EMAI in 2020, sharing her art knowledge with the exhibition team and composing our regular newsletter these last 12 months. Since 2020, Leanne has maintained the "books". 

Shepparton Textile Artists Inc.

Shepparton Textile Artists (STA) are a group of women who are not keen on following rules – we like to explore, experiment, tinker, and play as we create our art. The Creative Textile Group first formed in 2003, with Margaret Lowry, Wendy Cook, and Ella Egan some of the founding members, and Margaret the inaugural president.

This year, we have brought our annual exhibition to The Foundry Arts Space, Echuca. The Foundry, with its flexible space, is ideal for a group like ours, who tend to create extremely varied works. The group installation will be astonishing – and, as with all textile works, it's best to allow yourself plenty of time for close looking.

The word Chrysalis comes from the Greek khrysallis, literally, "golden

pupa of the butterfly". Figuratively, it can also signify a stage of

development or change, a transitional state, or rebirth. Shepparton Textile Artists are excited to present our interpretation of the theme Chrysalis. A central part of this exhibition is the group installation of hanging coneshaped vessels reflecting the diversity of textile art techniques. Individual artists have experimented with felting, eco-dyeing, slow stitching, basketry, free-motion machine embroidery, crochet, cord-making, hand embroidery, beading, collage, and more.





As kids we are brainwashed by fairy tales, movies and even Disney. We are made to believe that we need to find our Prince Charming / beautiful Princess or perfect partner to have our happily ever after. The idea that love will solve all our problems, and we are pushed and forced into these ideals and traditions, which are very dated and archaic.

This exhibition challenged the idea that after the wedding, not everything is happily ever after.

Being married isn't always what it is romanticised as, as when we are kids. Every relationship is a rollercoaster, riding the highs and lows. But some couples don't last the ride, due to infidelity, kids, mortgages, cost of living and the pressure of marriage itself. This exhibition explored this idea in the artist's tongue in cheek way.

Mr Dimples is a happily single artist, celebrating the idea of happily never after. He has dealt with this idea of dated stereotypes in his older work. Exploring the concepts that people should live their own lives, and not be forced down the path of marriages, house and kids living in perfect Suburbia, but also not be constantly questioned and frowned upon about this way of life.

We recently opened Mr Dimple's exhibition: Domestic Bliss. The opening of the art exhibition was a thoughtful gathering, with the public appreciating the unique characters portrayed in the artist's work.


PACKING ROOM PRIZE:
