Your submissions will be recorded and kept. You can apply at any time. Exhibiting members are asked to gallery-sit for 2-3 shifts during their Members Gallery exhibition: 10am - 1pm or 1pm - 4pm or a whole day. "Gallery Two" is a dynamic space with moveable walls allowing multiple configurations of art.


