### Vicki Walker spoke to us about this year's NAIDOC exhibition:

"We've named it 'Our Women, Our Strength'. The theme for NAIDOC this year is 'The next Generation: Strength, Vision and Legacy' so the work that's in the space will be a whole new generation of women in particular who are taking up the craft, and traditional craft that was done by our elder women. So it's a pretty special exhibition because it is only women.

Denise Morgan Bulled who has always done these alongside of me is the reason these exhibitions take place every year. We have a fabulous relationship with The Foundry Arts volunteers and absolutely love the NAIDOC exhibitions every year and really look forward to them. We are so well supported by this crew that it's comfortable. When you hear that laughter that's because we are comfortable and it feels safe for us to be here and it feels like we're actually loved and it's pretty nice.

This is the 14th year that some of our women have been involved, popping artwork in. Some of them aren't with us any more and that's a little bit sad. Every year we try to include Vera Cooper who was also with us from the very beginning. We have a little piece of her work included again this year with a little story attached to that. So that's pretty special for us as well. Some of her family come in and do little things here with The Foundry.

Some of our women come in and sit around and talk with the other members of The Foundry and do some work. It doesn't happen all the time but that just indicates how comfortable we are to be in this space. It's not often in too many spaces that we feel like that, so always a big thanks to the Foundry members.

There's a lot of Yorta Yorta women and there's a lot of weavers and master weavers from right across the state. Not all of them just weave. Denise is a weaver but a lot of them are artists who have held exhibitions themselves and have work in the National Gallery. There's a lot of really big work and installations and collaborative work that these women have done as well. I think it's going to be very moving and probably one of the best we've seen.

The women this year are doing some of their traditional craft or things that only women do. Even though men might have knitted or made nets, these are traditional daily women's things. So it's working with fabric and fur and feathers and fibre. There's lots of really beautiful things."



Workshops are always in in high demand and The Foundry Arts Space is happy to provide space for them.


Exhibiting artists are always offered the opportunity to hold demonstrations and workshops during their exhibitions.









"Where do the owls go to dream? explores the unseen forces that guide us... intuition, memory, and the framework of our inner worlds. The owl protagonists are not simply birds—they are archetypes, messengers, protectors, and fragments of our own becoming. Inspired by the landscape that shaped my earliest sense of magic, these painted portraits and textile talismans offer a quiet invitation: where do we go when we close our eyes... and who is watching over us when we do?" Olivia Rae Razuki creates richly detailed works that explore themes of transformation, the inner world and spirituality. Growing up in Echuca on Yorta Yorta land, Olivia is deeply inspired by nature and local flora and fauna. Each painting is a portal inviting viewers to linger, reflect, and find meaning and beauty in the mysteries and magic of life.







"My art is confronting and honest. I like to produce works that have the potential to make people feel uncomfortable. The subjects I deal with are usually based around raw emotion, and are often topics that people tend to turn a blind eye to." <u>Gavin North This exhibition contains adult themes. Children must be supervised by an adult.</u>

Gavin has had success as an artist both at home in Australia and abroad. He holds a diploma of visual arts from Victoria University, and a Bachelor of fine arts—painting from The Victorian College of the

Arts.





The annual exhibition program is designed to offer the opportunity for local and national artists to exhibit in this unique space. The curators will be looking for a diverse range of exhibitions with a cross section of art styles and genres. The aim is to deliver a fresh, unique experience to the community and visitors to the Echuca Moama region.

The opening date for Expressions of Interest submissions is 1 July, 2025 and the closing date is 30th September, 2025.

The Foundry Arts Space Inc. (formerly Echuca Moama Arts Initiative Inc.), is a not-for-profit volunteer run community organisation established in 2010 to raise the profile of the arts and cultural activities in our region.

The Foundry Arts Space is located in a restored foundry building in the heart of the historic Echuca Port precinct. The Foundry Arts Space welcomes artists, musicians and all creatives to share this historic but contemporary building. The Foundry attracts over 10,000 visitors a year.
